Other facilities include the following:


- Well-equipped science laboratories

St Hannah's School was founded in 1981 and has enjoyed a long history of academic success. The school caters for children aged 18 months to 18 years. St. Hannah's comprises an early learning center (play group, reception, PPI & PP2), a mixed primary and junior secondary school, a boys' high school and a girls' high school in separate campuses. There are optional boarding facilities from Grade 4 in our Karen campus and mandatory boarding for both high schools. From a humble start with a nursery school at Kindaruma Road in 1981, the school now occupies a total of 5 campuses, one in Kilimani, one in Runda (from 2023), and three campuses in Karen.



THE CURRICULA:

We are a private school offering the national curricula, 8-4-4 and CBC.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:



St. Hannah's prides itself in providing a wholesome educational experience. Co-curricular activities include swimming, tennis, basketball, soccer, ballet, Music, drama, inter-house competitions and strong scouting or St. John's movements. The school also offers French in the primary schools, and Computer Studies in all schools. In 2019, St. Hannah's won First Position in the National Music Festival in the piano category. In 2020, one of our high school students earned a full scholarship to Dartmouth, an Ivy League institution in USA, to study Architecture, courtesy of basketball, which she learned in our school.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS:

St. Hannah's has a strong track record of academic performance. Pupils consistently excel as evidenced by the following:

- Bugei Nyaosi was the best candidate in the country with 472 marks out of 500 in the KCPE exam of 2004. He proceeded to Starehe Boys Centre where he was the second best student in the country in KCSE 2008. He was admitted to Stanford University, an American Ivy League institution.
- David Gathuku was the 9th best KCPE candidate in 2005 with 453 marks. He proceeded to Mang'u High School where he was the best KCSE candidate in 2009 countrywide.
- KCPE 2021: The best candidates in the school had 414 marks. 79% of the candidates had 350 marks and above. 97% of the pupils had over 300 marks. The pass rate was 99.5%.
- KCSE 2021: Both high schools achieved a mean grade of C+. Three candidates had A-. The top score was A plain.
